

AMA (American Medical Association) Quick Reference Citation Guide

References:

- Cited works are numbered in order of initial appearance in the text, and appear in the Reference List in numerical order.
- Use arabic superscript numerals outside periods and commas, and inside colons and semicolons.
- List authors' names as follows: Doe JL, Smith KT.
- Use accepted abbreviations of journal names from the PubMed Journals database (http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/nlmcatalog/journals)

In-Text Examples:
